



Until March of 2021, all students continued to attend virtual classes as a Covid safety measure. Safely and slowly, we began to transition students back to in-person classes. But thanks to our innovative virtual classes specially designed for adults with intellectual disabilities, we found that many students THRIVED in an online setting. Because virtual classes provide a sensory-friendly environment and meaningful enrichment to students that live far outside of Tulsa, Pathways decided to adopt our unique virtual classes as a permanent option for students and families. A Parent's Desire for Her Child to Progress, Not Regress



100% of caregivers surveyed reported that the program has helped enhance their student's quality of life

86% of caregivers surveyed reported seeing growth in their student's independence skills and confidence

A loving parent desires to know their son or daughter is thriving! At Pathways, we often hear parents share that it comforts them to know they can go to work, run errands, or have time for themselves while their student is in a safe environment, learning, and having positive interactions with teachers and friends.

Most parents of adults with intellectual disabilities realize they might not become empty nesters as quickly as parents of neurotypical children. At Pathways, we help support students and their families by providing our students with the tools they need to become more independent at home and in their everyday lives. Sandi, a single mom of Pathways student Joey, shares that Pathways has instilled a greater feeling of confidence in Joey that he is capable of so much. This past year, she saw that confidence at home, especially as he practiced making his own food and snacks and was able to replicate recipes he's learned in class.




Volunteers served in-person and virtually 638 hours to impact the lives of our students and their families. That translates to \$18,846 of value for our program.



Revenue includes \$129K in future years' pledges receivable recorded in 2021, \$60K funds raised restricted to Scholarship Fund, and 168K in bequests received.
