How We Started

Pathways was founded in 2009 as an outgrowth of Kirk of the Hills church, thanks to the help and direction of Crystal Fulda. Adults with intellectual disabilities needed a place to live happier, healthier, and more meaningful lives after high school graduation, so Pathways Adult Learning Center was formed. In 2015, we became our own 501(c)3 nonprofit. Now we operate 40 hours a week and serve over 100 students in-person and virtually.

Vision

We assist each individual to achieve emotional, cognitive, physical, social, and spiritual growth to his or her fullest potential.

We provide a unique Christian program dedicated to enhancing the quality of life for adults with intellectual disabilities.

WHAT WE OFFER

In-person Classes

4 hours per week to 40 hours per week, we provide in-person continued education and respite care for adults with intellectual disabilities. Students also participate in community activities like volunteering, field trips, and Special Olympics.

Virtual Classes

Virtual classes offer the convenience of Pathways programming from the comfort of home. Students get a highly interactive learning experience that caters to their individual needs.
